Remarks

- Animal under 2 months old and or more than 4 weeks pregnant must not be imported. Animals will not be released from quarantine unless they are over 5 months old.
- Note: A combined Veterinary Health, Residence and Vaccination Certificate is acceptable. The certificates must be signed and stamped by either a full time salaried government veterinary officer or a registered veterinary surgeon and endorsed by a full time salaried government veterinary officer.
- To facilitate correct certification, a Zoo-Sanitary Certificate (Form VC-9R, issued together with the permit) or equivalent should be used.
- The Veterinary Health Certificate, Residence Certificate and Vaccination Certificate must apply to a single animal.
